- Students engaging in Project Based Learning (PBL)

What is Project Based Learning (PBL)?

- Method of delivering student-centered instruction
- Is worked on for an extended period of time
- Students work together to solve real-world problems by deciding a goal and designing the project
- o Teacher assists students by guiding the project forward

Perks of Project Based Learning

- Connects well with science, but also many other subjects
- o Research says students enjoy PBL more than traditional projects
- o Students always share and present their final products
- o Students develop real-world problem-solving skills
- o Students work collaboratively with one another
- Driving questions gives students more freedom of choice and creativity to explore diverse answers

Steps to Success:


- 1) Create broad topics of interest for students
- 2) Find the main idea that is of most interest and detailed to students
- 3) Use driving questions, formative assessment, and organize student roles
- 4) Using the student's skills and creativity, assist in the brainstorming process of what they can do to express findings
- 5) Organize obtaining an audience

What does it mean for students to take ownership?

- Choices in their learning
- Leadership opportunities
- Accountability among both peers and the teacher
- Responsibility for their learning

What is Project Based Learning (PBL)?

- Method of delivering student-centered instruction
- Allows students to work together to solve real-world problems
- Learning occurs through research and design approaches
- Provides students with hands-on experiences, encouraging creativity

How is PBL different from just a traditional class project?

- Provides opportunities for students to have a voice and a choice!

What is a driving question?

- Topic for each PBL project
- Are engaging and open ended, allowing for student interpretation and variety on their end product
- Are easily aligned to learning goals

Encouraging Real World Connections

- Real world problems are frequently at the heart of driving questions
- PBL fosters 21st Century Skills:
 - Collaboration
 - Decision making
 - Integrative (cross-curriculum) thinking
 - o Research
 - Technology

Crafting a Driving Question

- Engaging for students
- Must be relevant, clear, and hook student
- Has to be open ended with diverse answers
- Could connect to a real-world problem, debatable issue, or charge for action

| Traditional Questions | Driving Questions |

Why is there pollution in our town lake? | How can we plan an effective garage sale? If you were to make a new app, what would it be and look like? What should we do about the aphids in the garden? How can we stop the pollution in our town lake? |
